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INTERNATIONAL PUBLIC NOTICE

regarding the proclamation of December 8, 2017 by Donald J. Trump

The National assembly, the governing body for the Government of The United States of America, has directed this office to articulate its position regarding the December 8, 2017, [proclamation](#) issued by United States President, Donald J. Trump.

To open, we wish to take this opportunity to applaud the efforts of the Trump administration in its attempt to end the corruption it believes has overwhelmed the United States' political system and destroyed its reputation within the international community.

We also commend the administration's on-going efforts to expose sexual predators and their crimes. There are more layers to this systemic villainy than what has been exposed by the "corporate" media and this Government supports, unequivocally, the full disclosure of sexual exploitation from verbal harassment to unwanted physical contact to forced prostitution and to the ugliness and horror of pedophilia.

The Government of The United States of America offers its assistance in these efforts.

As a government founded upon the principles of Human Rights, the Government of The United States of America, voices its gratitude to the Trump administration for bringing the subject of Human Rights to the public with the proclamation of December 8, 2017.

However, we feel it is important to point out that [Executive Order #13107](#), "The Implementation of Human Rights Treaties", was signed December 10, 1998, by William Jefferson Clinton, making the United States a party to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

Of no less importance, in 2002 and 2003, George W. Bush, signed [National Security Presidential Directive 22](#), as well as [Executive Order 13257](#) to combat trafficking in persons.

Sadly, these directives and Executive Orders, now spanning two decades of existence, have produced no meaningful Human Rights compliant changes to the public policy of the United



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States. Indeed, for those with eyes to see, it has not been Human Rights that have been promoted and implemented over the last twenty years, but rather, the police-state.

As such, this Government is forced to conclude that these Executive Orders and directives were, in effect, mere statements offered for public consumption to provide political cover for the United States, as it continues to violate Human Rights as a matter of public policy.

Although this National Government respects the implied intent of the Trump administration and its recent announcement, without observable action on the part of the United States, this Government remains unmoved.

To be clear, speeches, papers and the creation of holidays will not absolve the United States from international liability nor hide the myriad violations of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, institutionalized within the public policy of the United States.

Thus, we are forced to ask: is the intent of the Trump administration to merely announce holidays or to begin the righteous pursuit of bringing the United States into compliance with the Universal Declaration of Human Rights? Has the time arrived, for example, for the United States to publicly acknowledge the Continental dollar, authorized by this Government as national currency, and for the United States to take the necessary actions to end the perpetual debt-slavery instituted by foreign interests? Has the time arrived to acknowledge that the United States is foreign to the States of the Union, and that this Government possesses the authority to administer oaths and affirmations of Nationality to The United States of America? Has the time arrived for the United States to acknowledge intangible property rights within its public policy and pursue prosecutions only within its limited jurisdiction? As the proclamation outlined no plan of action, only time will tell.

This Government extends an invitation to the United States to discuss the above-mentioned action points as well as others, in hopes of bringing about meaningful and positive change.

We, the members of the National assembly for the Government of The United States of America, remain steadfast in our belief that Human Rights are to be acknowledged and respected by all entities and individuals, during all activities and within all venues and we remain undeterred in our efforts to expose and hold accountable those that violate the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.
